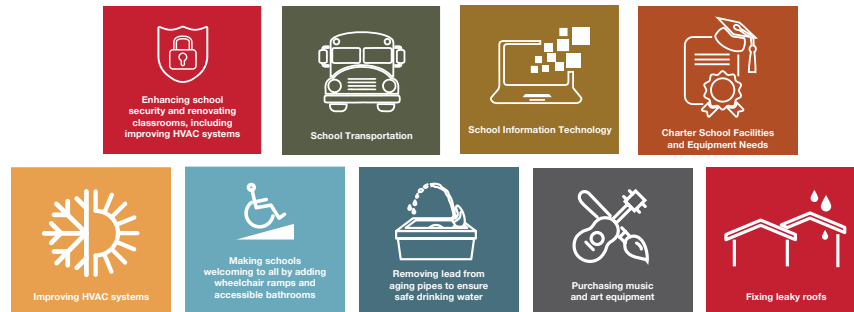


NOVEMBER 2023 SCHOOL MILL LEVY ELECTION OVERVIEW

BETTER SCHOOLS BUILD BETTER COMMUNITIES



On November 7 2023, APS District voters will be asked to ratify continuing the Public Schools Capital Improvements tax. (SB-9 Mill Levy) that will begin in tax year 2025 through tax year 2030. This will be a reauthorization of the current 6 year Public School Mill Levy that was approved by voters in November 2019 and will expire in 2024. This reauthorization if approved will result in property tax rates staying the same and will not result in a tax increase. The election is being held 2 years before the expiration of the current authorization due to changes in NM election law in 2018 that require school district elections to occur in November of non-general election odd years (2024 is a general election year).

IT IS ESTIMATED THAT APPROVAL OF THIS MILL LEVY WILL GENERATE \$264,673,790 OVER 6 YEARS STARTING IN TAX YEAR 2025 THROUGH TAX YEAR 2030.

When will the Election be held?

As part of the regular local election to be held Tuesday, November 7, 2023. Absentee voting will begin October 10 2023. Early voting will begin October 21 to November 4 2023

Who can vote?

All registered voters living within the Albuquerque Public Schools District are eligible to vote in the November 7, 2023 School Mill Levy Election. This includes all of the city of Albuquerque, Bernalillo County and the Village of Corrales in Sandoval County.

What is being voted on?

Mill Levy Question:

Continuation of a Public Schools Capital Improvements Tax (Mill Levy)	<p>“Shall the Albuquerque Municipal School District No. 12 continue to impose a property tax of \$2.00 per each \$1,000.00 of net taxable value for property within the District under the Property Tax Code which includes residential, non-residential and oil and gas for the property tax years 2025, 2026, 2027, 2028, 2029 and 2030 for the purpose of (1) erecting, remodeling, making additions to, providing equipment for or furnishing public school buildings, including teacher housing and pre-kindergarten classroom facilities; (2) payments made pursuant to a financing agreement for the leasing of a building or other real property with an option to purchase for a price that is reduced according to payments made; (3) purchasing or improving public school grounds; (4) administering the projects undertaken pursuant to sections 1 and 3 above, including expenditures for facility maintenance software, project management software, project oversight and district personnel specifically related to administration of projects funded by the Public School Buildings Act provided that expenditures pursuant to this section shall not exceed five percent of the total project cost; (5) purchasing and installing education technology improvements, excluding salary expenses of school district employees, but including tools used in the educational process that constitute learning and administrative resources, and that may also include: (6) satellite, copper and fiber-optic transmission; computer and network connection devices; digital communication equipment, including voice, video and data equipment; servers; switches; portable media devices, such as discs and drives to contain data for electronic storage and playback; and purchase or lease of software licenses or other technologies and services, maintenance, equipment and computer infrastructure information, techniques and tools used to implement technology in schools and related facilities; and (7) improvements, alterations and modifications to, or expansions of, existing buildings or tangible personal property necessary or advisable to house or otherwise accommodate any of the tools listed herein?”</p> <div data-bbox="389 766 1502 835"><p>FOR Public School Capital Improvements Tax <input type="checkbox"/></p><p>AGAINST Public School Capital Improvements Tax <input type="checkbox"/></p></div>
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Major Functions/Projects that passage of the School Mill Levy Election of 2023 will make possible for 144 APS Schools and 50 Charter Schools

1. School Facility Maintenance including roofs, Heating & Cooling, and old water pipe replacement
2. School Security/safety equipment/upgrades for all Schools, Students & teachers
3. School Library Equipment
4. School Student & Teacher classroom furniture
5. School Student & Teacher Learning Informational Technology (includes student/teacher computers and learning devices)
6. American Disabilities Act (ADA) compliance upgrades for all schools
7. Artificial Turf/Water and Energy Conservation upgrades for all schools
8. School Music/Fine Arts Instruments & Equipment for all Schools
9. School Physical Education Equipment for all Schools
10. Career Technical Education (CTE) tools/equipment for all schools
11. Funding for all APS area Charter Schools Facilities & Equipment
